Anaesthetic machines are to be presented in a clean and safe condition for use. All ancillary equipment must be in safe reliable operating condition for use. Must bring to attention of anaesthetist and technicians any fault discovered in equipment. Preparation and assistance for spinal, epidural, and regional anaesthetic procedures. Provide assistance outside the operating theatre when required by the anaesthetist. These duties may at times be required in the CT/MRI scanning suite, Emergency Department and ICU.
